### (Un)common Cures

When rinsing muddy clothes with cold water, turn them inside out. Flushing the dirty side with water will only grind the mud into the fabric.

To tighten loose louvers on wood shutters, locate the tension screw (on the edge of the panel) and use a Phillips head screwdriver to turn it clockwise in small increments, checking the tension after each adjustment.

### **Raindrop Walk**

When a drop of rain falls on the Lenexa civic campus, it begins a long and busy journey to the heart of the City Center Watershed. Across the watershed, the City of Lenexa uses traditional stormwater treatment methods


paired with natural solutions to clean and carry this rainfall to its

destination.

Lenexa's Raindrop Walk is a self-quided walking tour that takes you on the journey of a raindrop. From the Lenexa Rec Center's main entrance to a bridge over the creek that carries water to Shawnee Mission Lake, you will venture across six stops throughout the 0.55 mile walk (1.1 miles round trip).

At each sign, you'll learn what challenges we face in protecting our water supply, how Lenexa treats rain runoff and ways you can help improve water quality at home - many of which you can receive reimbursement for through the Cost Share Program. Learn more about each of the six stops below.

# **Nice Spring Walk**

The South Loop Trail at Shawnee Mission Park is now open! The new 2-mile paved trail connects the Gary L. Haller Trail near Shelter 8 to the Walnut Grove and Parkhurst trails near Shelter 10 and Walnut Grove, creating a 5-mile-long paved loop all the way around Shawnee Mission Park. This addition provides a scenic and accessible route for walkers, runners, and cyclists looking to enjoy the park's natural beauty. ### **Series**



### **Book**

The River We Remember by William Kent Krueger

Set in 1958 in a small Minnesota town, *The River We Remember* begins when the body of wealthy landowner Jimmy Quinn is found in the Alabaster River on Memorial Day. As Sheriff Brody Dern investigates the murder, long-buried secrets and old wounds resurface, exposing the town's deep divisions. The townspeople quickly suspect Noah Bluestone, a Japanese American World War II veteran who recently moved to the area with his Indigenous wife, fueling racial and cultural tensions. As Brody digs deeper, he must confront his own painful past while navigating a community filled with prejudice, loyalty, and hidden truths. The novel weaves together multiple perspectives, painting a rich and complex portrait of small-town life and the human capacity for both kindness and cruelty. With beautiful prose and a gripping mystery, *The River We Remember* explores themes of justice, redemption, and the lingering effects of war.

# **Easy Crab Cakes**



Ingredients:

Lump crab meat

3 Scallions

11/3 c Bread crumbs

3-4 tbsp Mayonniase

Lemon slice

1/4 tsp Salt

1/2 tsp Pepper

### Remoulade

1 c greek yogurt

2 tbsp dijon mustard

2 tsp cajun seasoning

1/2 tsp horseradish

1 tsp minced garlic

salt

pepper

### Crab Cake Directions

- 1. Thinly slice scallions and add to bowl
- 2. Stir in bread crumbs and mayonnaise, salt and pepper
- 3. Fold in crab, try not to stir
- 4. Scoop about 1/2 cup and make a patty
- 5. Pan fry in olive olive until each side is crispy brown
- 6. Serve with lemon slices and remoulade

### Remoulade Directions

- 1. Whisk together the Greek yogurt, dijon mustard, cajun seasoning, smoked paprika, horseradish, pickle relish, garlic, and lemon juice.
- 2. Transfer to a serving dish along with crab cake
