BLUE SKIES AND BLUEBIRDS



As March arrives, watch for the bright colors and listen for the lovely birdsong of bluebirds in Red Oak Hills. The Johnson County Park and Recreation District (JCPRD) is the official "Bluebird Capital of Kansas". Designated in 1999, this title is the result of efforts begun by one Shawnee resident and continued by many. Frank Rollf created the recovery program in 1989 to combat the alarming decline in Eastern Bluebird numbers. He installed 16 nesting boxes along the Mill Creek Streamway Park. Dick Imel and Paul Gerling also played pivotal roles in revitalizing the population numbers. Today, there are nearly 400 boxes and 1700 bluebird fledglings

annually. JCPRD Bluebird Stewards monitor these nesting boxes.

Male bluebirds locate the perfect nesting cavity or box and start defending their territories in late February and early March. Bluebirds are cavity nesters whose natural nesting sites are tree holes they do not make themselves. Action to help the bluebird population was necessary because clearing land and eliminating dead trees have destroyed many cavity nesting sites. Another major detriment to bluebirds is the overwhelming competition from non-native starlings and house sparrows.

Bluebirds voraciously prey on insects. Bluebirds will not visit typical seed-filled bird feeders. To attract bluebirds, make cornmeal suet by mixing yellow corn meal, bacon grease, and bits of fruit or raisins. This could be a fun activity to do with children. The recipe for the food and then an exercise in patience called bird watching.
