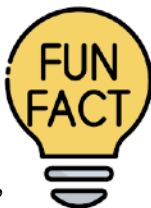


Did You Know?

With the World Cup coming this summer, the HOA wants to provide you with information about short-term rentals. Did you know that the Red Oak Hills Deed Restrictions prohibit short-term rentals within our community? Leases must be for a minimum of six (6) consecutive months. Rentals for shorter periods — including arrangements through platforms such as Airbnb and Vrbo — are not permitted. No lot or dwelling or any portion thereof may be used to provide temporary housing to guests for a commercial purpose. These restrictions are part of our recorded governing documents and were established to help preserve the residential character, stability, and cohesiveness of our neighborhood. Homeowners are encouraged to review the complete language regarding leasing and other restrictions on the [Red Oak Hills website](#).

Midland Drive PROJECT



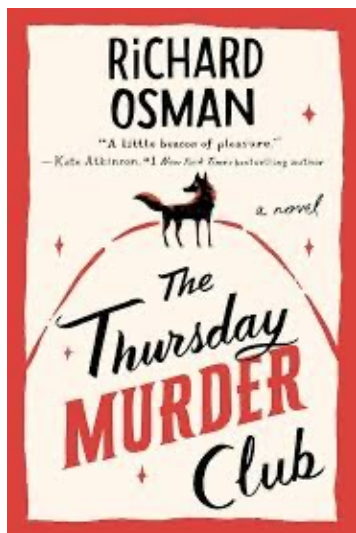
The City will start work on Midland Drive between Shawnee Mission Parkway and I-435 in late February or early March. demolition and rebuilding. Advance notice will be shared on the City of Shawnee's Facebook page.

The project will update the roadway, improve stormwater infrastructure, and add new sidewalks and bike lanes along more than 1.5 miles of Midland Drive.

Residents will have access to their homes throughout construction, though four full road closures are expected for Access to Elmridge Road, 66th Terrace, and Lawrence Road will remain open. The Midland Entertainment District will stay accessible from I-435, Shawnee Mission Parkway, Renner, and Midland east of I-435. Construction is expected to last through December, with updates posted on City social media and cityofshawnee.org/midland

The Thursday Murder Club by Richard Osman

In a quiet English retirement village, four friends meet weekly to review old murder cases for fun: sharp-tongued ex-union activist Ron, fearless former spy Elizabeth, gentle psychiatrist Ibrahim, and warm-hearted Joyce, who narrates with delightful honesty. But when a local developer is found dead, their hobby becomes a live investigation—complete with suspects, secrets, and a growing body count. What makes this one newspaper-perfect is the blend: it's genuinely twisty and page-turning, but also funny, humane, and surprisingly tender about aging, friendship, and purpose. The sleuthing is clever without being gritty, and the characters are so vivid that readers tend to finish the book already wanting the sequel.



Fresh Flavor Shirazi Salad

Ingredients

- 1 pound roma tomatoes aka plum tomatoes, finely diced
- 1 English cucumber finely diced
- 1/2 cup finely diced red onion
- 1/4 cup chopped mint or 2 teaspoons dried mint
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- 2 tablespoons chopped dill
- 4 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 4 tablespoons olive oil



Directions

- Mix the tomato, cucumber, and onion in a large bowl. Add the herbs and mix well
- Add the lime juice to a small bowl and whisk in the olive oil in a thin stream, whisking as you add it, to create an emulsion
- Customize this dish by adding chicken (or other protein of choice)
- Toss the veggies and herbs with the dressing, season with salt and pepper, and serve.
