Many locals have fond memories of the observation tower which was located just southwest of the dog park. Completed in 1964 and sponsored by the Sertoma Club, the tower offered views of the entire park. After 55 years, the tower was demolished in 2019. Rather than rebuild in SM Park, a new tower was constructed in Kill Creek Park. The Russell and Helen Means Observation Tower opened last summer. This 58' tower has an elevator and expansive views of the surroundings including the KC Speedway and University of Kansas. Kill Creek Park is located at 11670 Homestead Lane in Olathe, KS. Explore the park's many trails, swimming beach, playground and marina.

The Neighborly Thing to do

As new neighbors move into ROH please be mindful of speeding. Children are out playing and sometimes balls and pets get away

Don't tailgate slower vehicles. Be polite towards bicycles and scooters and keep a safe following distance until you can clearly pass them at a passing distance of greater than three feet.

On your way to Kill Creek Park, stop at Happy Valley Farm in DeSoto. This farm is a hidden gem of homemade jams, honey (from hives right there on the farm), press your own cider, farm fresh eggs and much more. Stop by the mini farmers market which sells blueberries in June, sweet

corn, tomatoes, melons (and so much more) in the summer and apple cider and pumpkins in the fall. Do you want to grow your own fruit? Check out the nursery!

Be sure to bring your jar to the farm and fill it with honey from the tap! This is fun and gets you the best price per pound. Of course, pre-bottled honey is ready to go as well. Visit http://happyvalleyfarm-ks.com/. The peach butter is highly recommended!



Pineapple, apricot and lime punch
